Programs

Montessori Kindergarten (09:00-14:00)

Ages: 2.5 to 6

Capacity: 36 children

Childcare staff: 5 (6 during Outdoor Time)

We offer a Montessori experience in line with the standards set by the Association Montessori Internationale: an uninterrupted 3-hour work cycle offering a full range of Montessori materials in the areas of practical life, sensorial, language, mathematics, and culture well as access to our rooftop outdoor space.

Afterschool Programs

Pre-Elementary (14:30 - 17:00)

Ages: 3 to 6

Capacity: 36 children/day

The perfect after-school fun for kindergarteners. After a Montessori work cycle, the children enjoy activities such as exploring the local area, tending vegetables on the rooftop, dancing, creating art and doing science experiments – all in English. No previous English experience is necessary.

Lower Elementary (15:00 - 17:00)

Ages : 6 to 9

Capacity: 8 children

An advanced class for lower elementary children to explore topics related to diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) through English. In this holistic project-based class, children will discuss their identities and interests, learn about diverse cultures and ideas and find ways to help their community.

Work Cycle

A Montessori work-cycle is a period of uninterrupted time that the child gets to work with the materials (activities) on the shelf. The children choose their work themselves based on what they want to learn, how they want to learn it and with whom. This is what sets Montessori apart: it is truly child-led learning. Children can work independently, in pairs or in large groups (with or without the teacher). In a typical work cycle, your child picks up work from the art shelf, language shelf, math shelf and practical life shelf. We also do group work every day (either in small groups or everybody together) where we sing, read stories, talk about our day and discuss various topics based on the month's theme. Our work cycle also includes science experiments, 'Show and Tell' Wednesdays and physical activities like dance and yoga.

モンテッソーリのワークサイクルは、子どもが棚にある教材(アクティビティ)と共に作業する、中断されない時間です。子どもたちは、何を学びたいか、どのように学びたいか、誰と一緒に学びたいかに基づいて、自分で作業を選びます。これがモンテッソーリを他と一線を画すもので、真に子ども主導の学びです。子どもたちは、先生なしで独立して、ペアで、または大規模なグループでワークに取り組むことができます。典型的なワークサイクルでは、子どもはアート、言語、数学、実用生活(プラクティカルライフ)の棚からワークを選びます。また、毎日グループワークも行います(小規模なグループまたはクラスみんな一緒に)で、歌を歌ったり、物語を読んだり、日常について話し合ったり、月のテーマに基づいてさまざまなトピックを話し合ったりします。私たちのワークサイクルには、科学実験、「Show and Tell」の水曜日、ダンスやヨガなどの身体活動も含まれています。
